

END-USE CLASSIFICATION OF PERUVIAN IMPORTS, 1891-1972

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End-use classification of Peruvian imports provides the basis for several sections of a forthcoming book on the economic history of Peru.¹ The aim of the present paper is to present the basic data on which those sections rest, and to supply a brief description of the methodology used to obtain our figures. Figures presented here are our final revised versions, which supersede preliminary data used in earlier studies.²

For economic historians of Peru, the foreign trade statistics provide the most reliable and comprehensive indicators of long-run structural changes in the economy. National income accounts are available only from 1942³,

whereas figures on exports and imports were published irregularly during the nineteenth century, and regularly (with a gap 1893-1896) since 1891.⁴ Despite the sometimes-capricious valuation techniques used by the Customs in constructing the statistics⁵, they emerge from scrutiny as reliable enough to support quite strong conclusions on issues such as import composition.

End-use classification of a country's imports is a familiar technique for estimating changes in the relative importance of various activities within the economy. First, in a country which relies heavily (as does Peru) upon imports for its supply of capital equipment, import data can be used to derive some idea of trends in modern-sector capital formation. Second, in an economy which starts with only an embryonic manufacturing sector, the progress of industrialisation can be traced, as the substitution of local production for various classes of imports leads to changes in import composition.⁶ Third, the specific types of capital goods and intermediate goods imported provide valuable clues to the character of the domestic activities which use these imported goods.

As early as the 1920's, Peruvian statisticians were classifying imports into the three broad categories 'capital goods', 'intermediate goods', and 'consumption goods'.⁷ The methodology used, unfortunately, was too arbitrary, and the categories too broad, to permit useful analysis. It was not until the 1960's that a detailed classification was undertaken, in the pioneering study by Vandendries.⁸ His classification, published by the Central Bank in the 1965 national accounts⁹, was based on the 'CUODE' system prepared by the United Nations¹⁰, and was carried back to the year 1950. The work on which the present paper rests began as a project to construct comparable tables for the 1920's, but subsequently developed into a longer-range study of the period from 1891 to 1946. With a few gaps, and some minor problems of comparability, we are now able to trace the composition of Peru's imports from 1891 through to 1972.

The construction of our tables was carried out over a period of several years' intermittent work, during which the level of detail of the classification was steadily increased. The CUODE system consists of ten broad end-use groups, containing 49 detailed categories. (See Chart I). The original project involved the calculation, by hand, of the ten main groups for all years from 1911 to 1930. It has also been possible, using the worksheets from those calculations, to derive data for six of the 49 detailed categories for the same period. Subsequently, the hand-worked tables were extended back to 1891, with full disaggregation into the detailed categories. At the time this work was done, we did not have available to us (in England) the full run of published statistics, and consequently our tables contain gaps for the years 1901, 1903-1907, and 1909-1910. (The gap for 1893-1896, as

already noted, corresponds to a period when statistics were not published). Consolidating the results of these two campaigns, we obtained the data presented in Table 1 (the ten main groups) and Table 2 (the detailed categories), covering the period 1891-1930.

Experience with the difficulty (not to mention the tedium) of extracting data by hand, indicated the advantages of using a computer. A computer programme was therefore used to analyse the statistics for years from 1928 to 1946 (excluding 1929). Results for the two years which overlap with Tables 1 and 2 (that is, for 1928 and 1930) indicate that despite some minor coding changes which were introduced at the time of preparing the computer programme, the data for the second period are reasonably comparable with those for 1891-1930. The results of the computer exercise appear in Table 3 (the ten main groups) and Table 4 (the detailed categories).

For the years 1947-1949, we again did not have the published statistics to hand, and there is therefore another gap until 1950, when the data published by the Central Bank begin. In Tables 5 and 6 we reproduce the Central Bank figures for the period 1950-1965, with percentages calculated from them; and in Tables 7 and 8 a further set of Central Bank figures for the years 1963 to 1972 are similarly reproduced. (It should be noted that the 1950-1965 figures are in US dollars, whereas all other tables in this paper are in Peruvian soles at current prices).

There are a number of classification problems in our tables. Perhaps most obvious is that relating to capital goods. In the CUODE system, capital goods are spread among Groups 7, 8 and 9, covering respectively agriculture, industries, and transport. (Agricultural transport equipment, for some reason, is classed in Group 7 rather than 9). Peruvian trade statistics prior to the Second World War, however, provide regrettably little detailed information on capital goods imports. The main reason for this was that most capital equipment

entered Peru either duty-free or under a very low duty, so that the Customs had no reason to collect information on this class of imports, beyond the aggregate declared values. The published trade statistics consequently provide only overall totals for categories such as 'machinery for agriculture and mining'; and the various revisions of the tariff schedule (particularly those of 1920 and 1927) worsened the situation by arbitrarily changing the basis of aggregation. For the purpose of our detailed CUODE analysis from 1891 to 1908 and from 1928 to 1947, we have therefore been obliged to invent an extra category to which we have assigned the code number 78, 'Unclassifiable Capital Goods, Various Sectors'. This category includes machinery, tools and equipment whose sectoral end use could not be deduced from the tariff schedule; and since this category makes up a sizeable proportion of total capital goods imports in most years, we were obliged to present only an aggregated total for Groups 7 and 8 in Tables 1 and 3. An indication of the extent to which disaggregated data is available is provided in Table 9, which summarises the Peruvian published figures for imports of capital equipment for the years 1913-1930.

The second major classification problem concerns textiles. In the early phase of import-substituting industrialisation in Peru, cotton and woollen textiles played a leading role; and given the widespread use of home-made clothing (particularly among poorer Peruvians), there are strong arguments for treating textiles as final consumer goods. The CUODE system, however, assigns them to Category 523 (elaborated agricultural/livestock commodities, destined for further industrial processing). For our analysis of import-substitution, it was necessary to extract textiles from Group 5 and add them to Groups 1 and 2, in order to arrive at an estimate of those types of imports which were subject to early substitution. Table 10 gives the figures for textile imports from 1891 to 1946.

A.third problem is the classification of military equipment and material. The CUODE manual, for reasons not altogether clear, classes imports of this type under Group 2, consumer durables. In our analysis we have followed this system; but the Central Bank tables, on which our Tables 5-8 below are based, exclude military equipment altogether. Reference to Table 4 shows that by the late 1940's, military imports were a tiny fraction of the total, so that the discrepancy between our series and the subsequent Central Bank data should not be too severe at the point at which they connect up. In the 1930's, however, the inclusion of military imports seriously affects our percentages for the years 1933-1935, and especially for 1934, when the proportion of military imports rose to over 11%. (The heavy arms imports of that year were stimulated by Peru's confrontation with Colombia in the Amazon Basin; and by government fears of possible armed risings within Peru, on the pattern of the 1932 APRA-led rebellion in Trujillo). To allow for this 'bulge' in arms imports, we have included in Tables 3 and 4 separate figures in brackets to show the percentage breakdown of imports excluding military equipment for the years 1933-1935.

Finally, the sizeable 'Other' category deserves some discussion. Most of the items in this category appear under headings in the tariff schedule which cannot be meaningfully interpreted ('unclassifiable') or which are completely unspecified (for example, the section in the schedule headed 'no-tarifadas'). A further component of 'other' is the list of items specified as 'miscellaneous' in the CUODE manual - art works, motion pictures, postage stamps, and so on. It should be noted that the Central Bank figures from 1950 on give only the last type of 'other' imports; items which were unspecified in earlier tariff schedules were, apparently, fully classified from 1950 on. (Or they have been assigned to specific CUODE categories in the Central Bank tables). For the earlier period, however, our data include all three varieties of 'other'. The vagaries of the changing tariff schedule

(particularly the very unsatisfactory versions in use between 1920 and 1922), combined with year-to-year variations in the laziness of Customs officials (most notable in 1943), lead to considerable variations in the size and significance of this residual category; but over the medium- and long-term, the main trends in import composition are not unduly affected.

Postscript: Not included in the main body of this paper, but possibly of use in conjunction with our tables, are the results of a crude breakdown of 1877 imports into the ten main groups. These figures are included at the end, as Table 11. It should be noted that the 1877 data are biased by the inclusion in Group 3 (fuel and lubricants) of bunker coal for the use of ships calling at Peruvian ports; this category of imports was excluded from later import statistics which covered only 'special trade' (i.e. excluding goods brought into Peru for re-export). The third column of Table 11 therefore shows percentages calculated with 'fuel and lubricants' excluded.
